# Egg-cozy




#### Head:

- Start: 3 chains forming a circle
- 1<sup>st</sup> round: 8 single crochets
- 2<sup>nd</sup> round: In every single crochet, two single crochets, you get 16 single crochets.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> round: In first single crochet, two single crochets and in the next single crochet, one single crochet, you get 24 single crochets.
- 4<sup>th</sup> round: In every single crochet, one single crochet, you still have 24 single crochets.
- 5<sup>th</sup> round: In first and second single crochet, one single crochet, in the third single crochet, two single crochets, you get 32 single crochets.
- 6<sup>th</sup> round: In every single crochet, one single crochet, you still have 32 single crochets.
- Continue until the head is large enough to cover an egg. I did 4 extra rounds.
- Last round: slip stitch.

Reminder: When you use a different kind of wool or coton the measurements mentioned above can vary. Always measure on your egg.






## Comb:

Crochet in the middle of the head a comb. Crochet one single crochet, three double crochets and one single crochet, do this 3 times in total.

#### Lobe:

- 1<sup>st</sup> hole: 1 single crochet, 3 double crochets and 1 single crochet
- 2<sup>nd</sup> hole: 1 single crochet, 3 double crochets and 1 single crochet







#### Beak:

In 1 hole: 1 single crochet, 2 double crochets, 1 double treble crochet, 1 double crochet and 1 single crochet.

### Eyes:

Stitch two beads on the head.

#### Finish off:

Insert all the loose threads to the inside and sew them "away". I used a normal sewing needle for this.
